Understanding LED Pixel Design

Every Amber LED Traffic Sign consists of thousands of LEDs arranged into pixels.

The pixel design determines:

- Daytime visibility
- Nighttime readability
- Display uniformity
- Energy consumption
- Service life
- Maintenance requirements

Different manufacturers may use different LED configurations, resulting in significant performance differences even when the display resolution appears identical.
